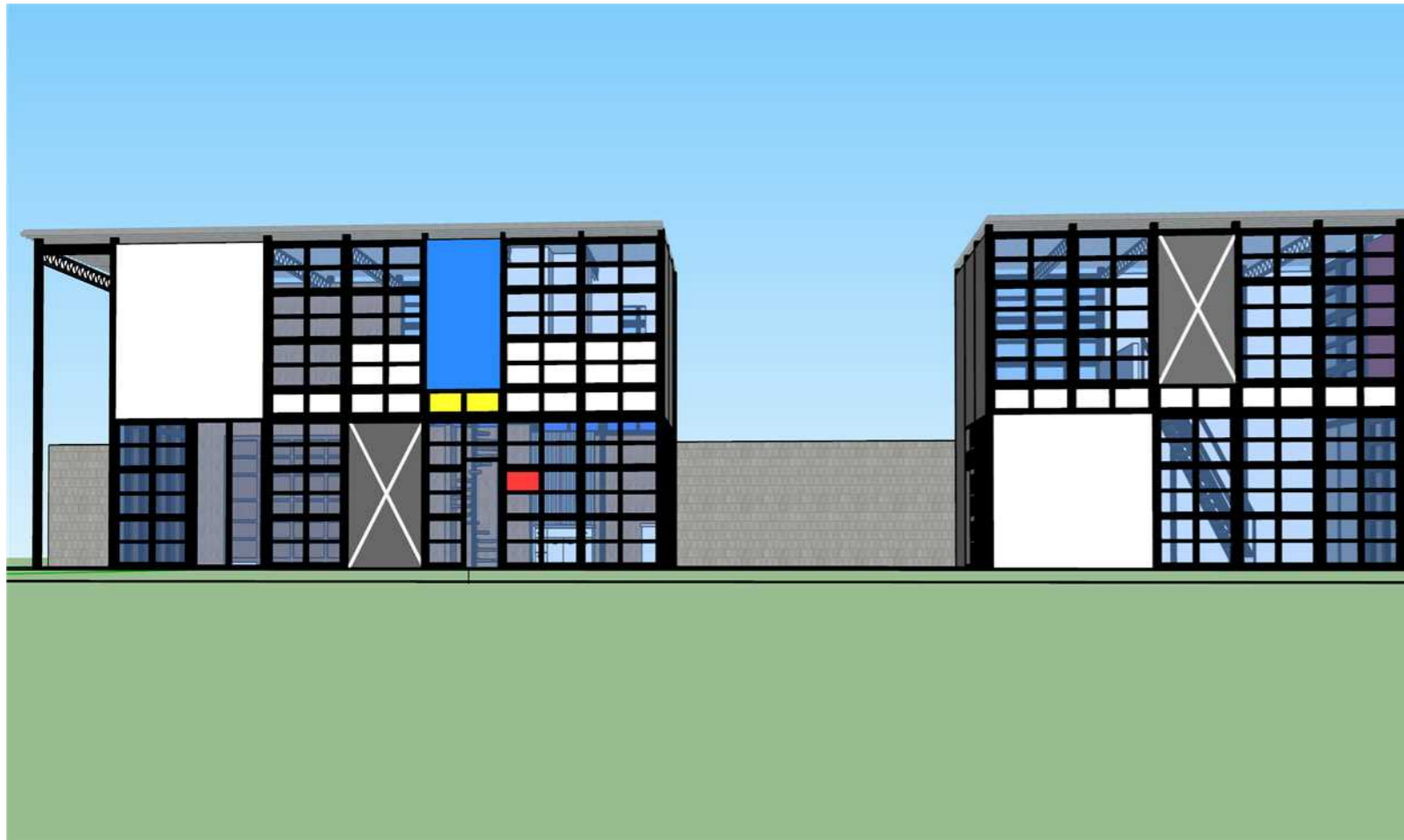
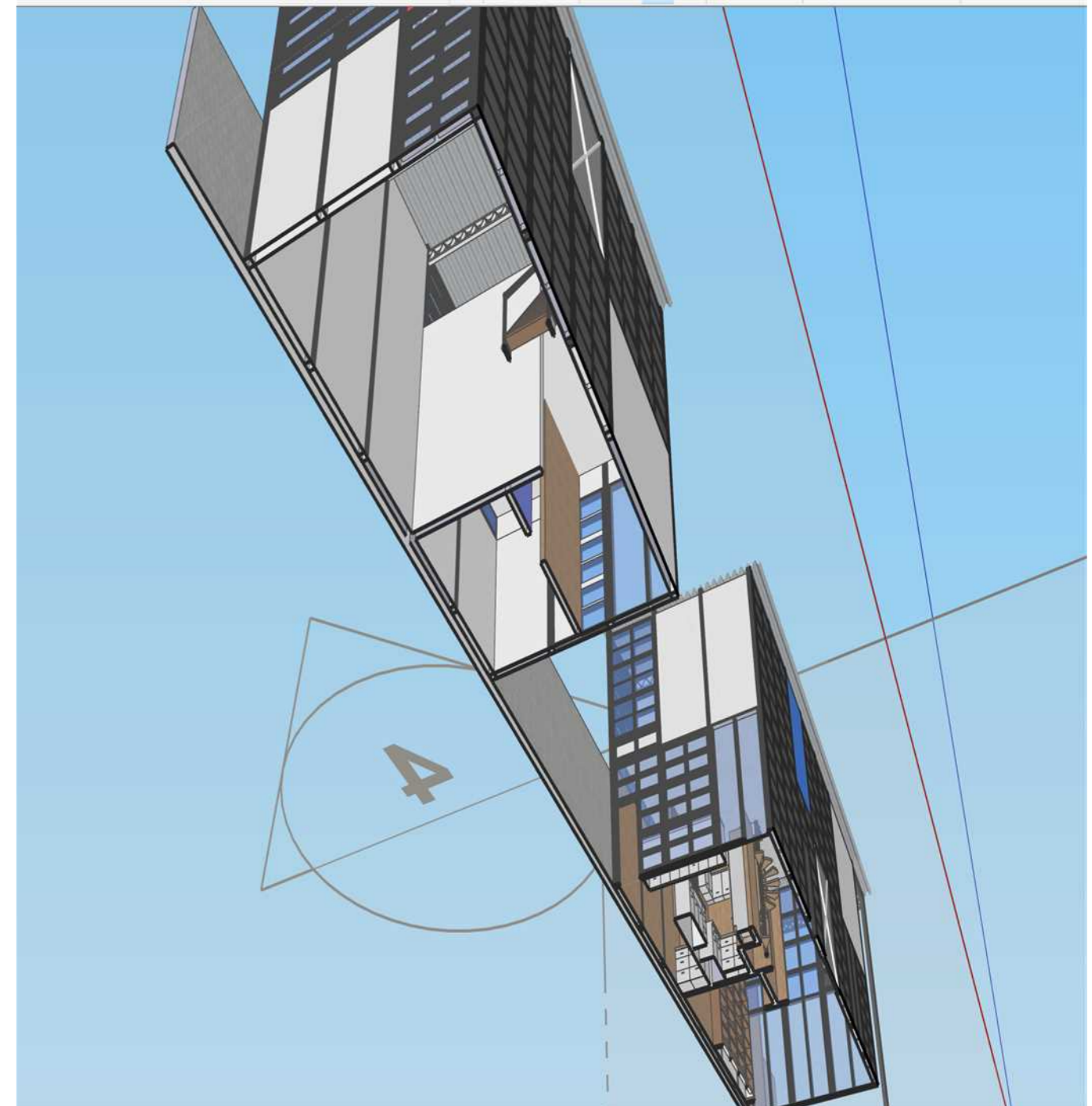


The Eames House

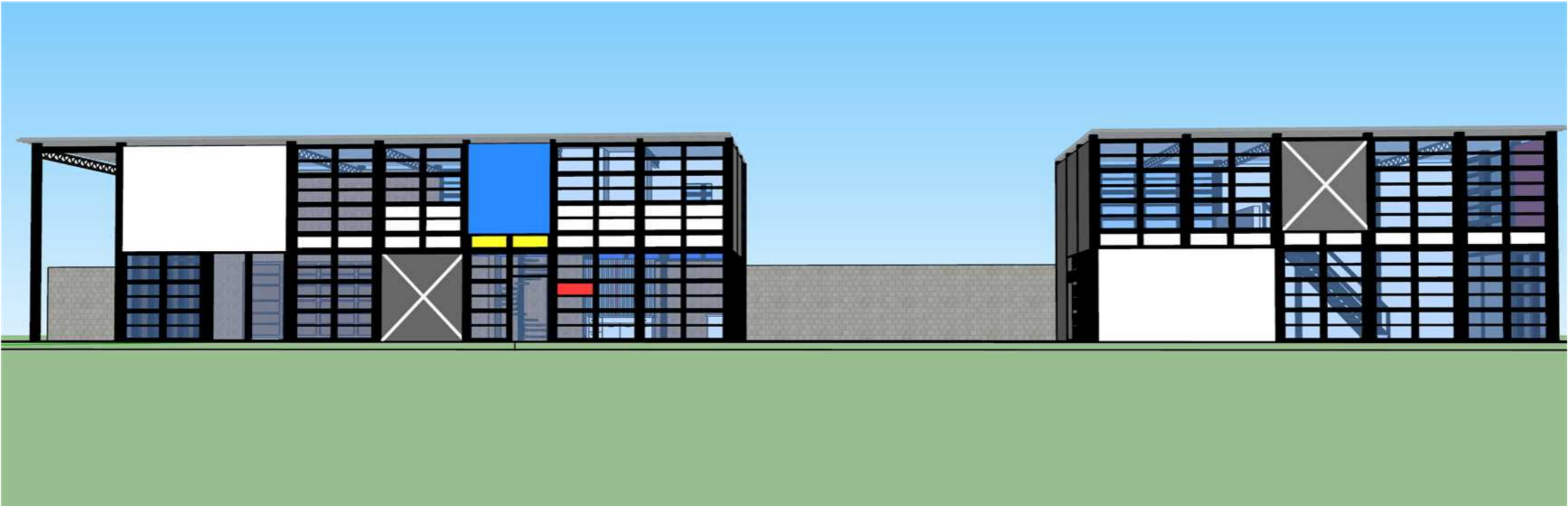

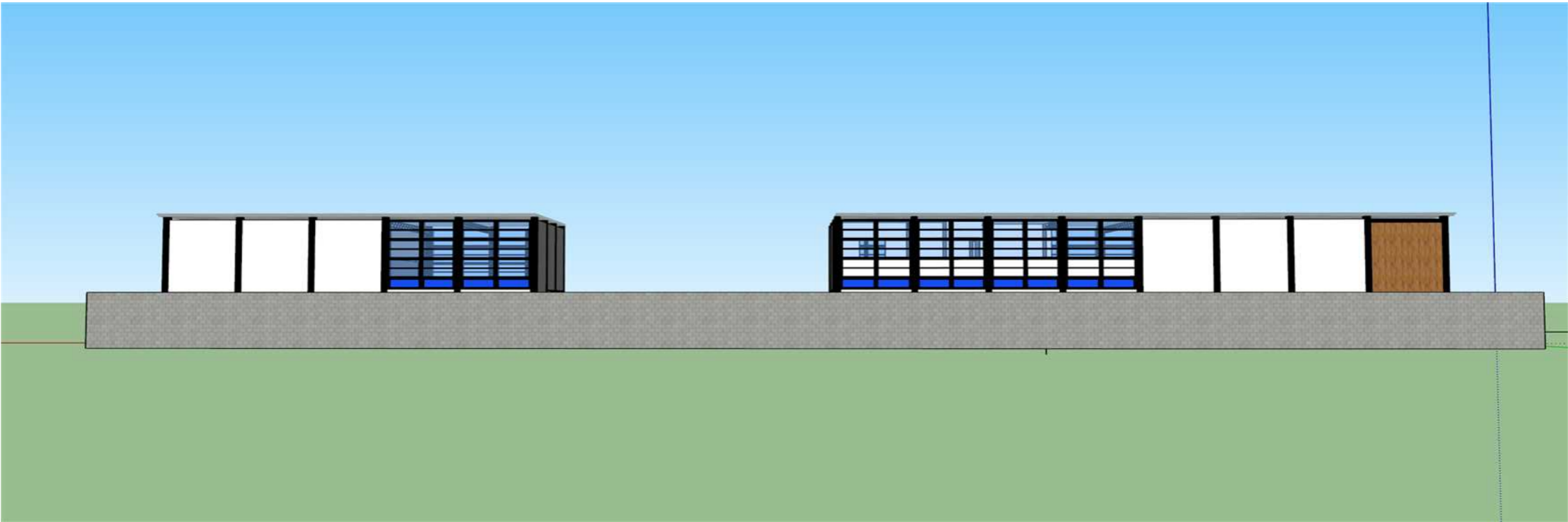

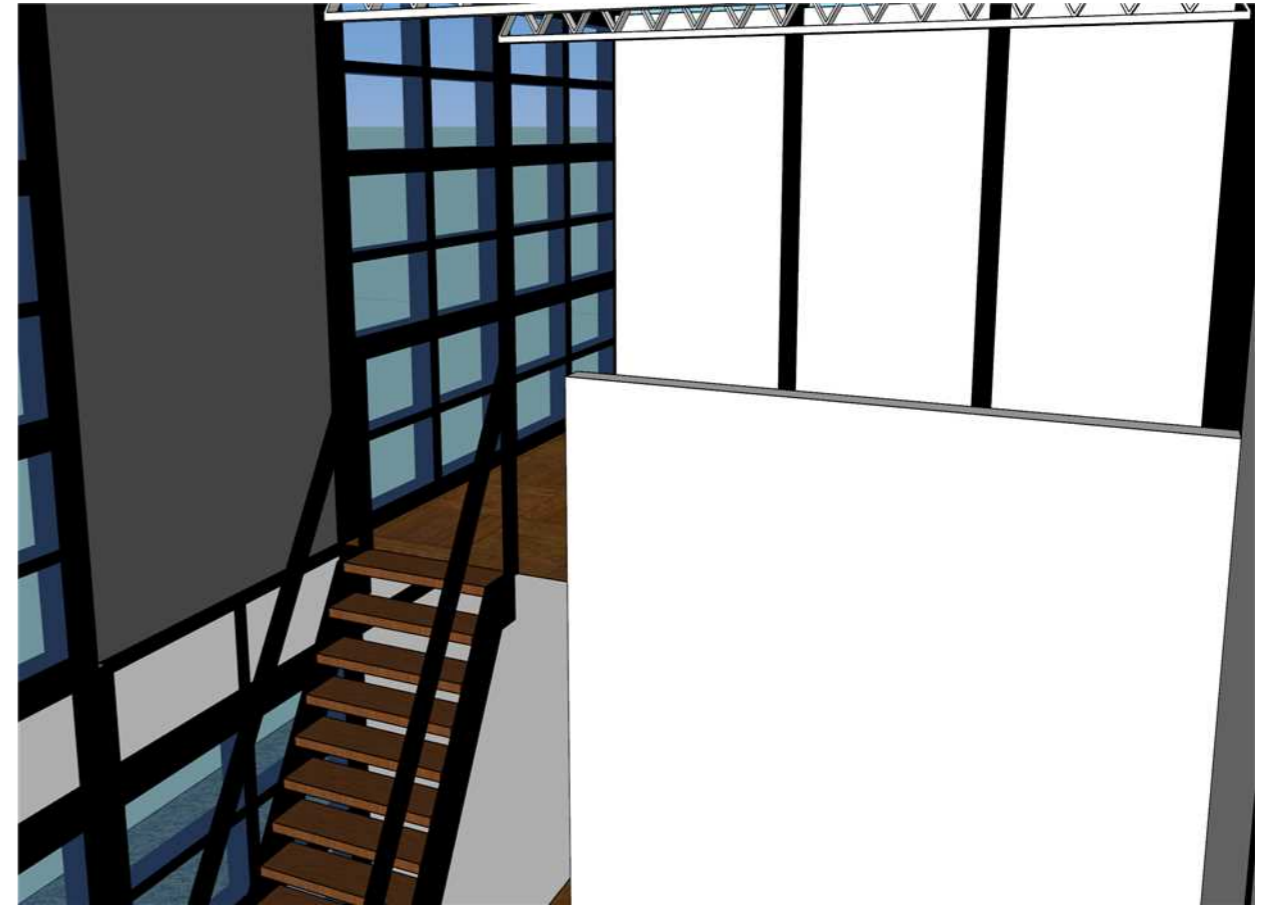


REAR ELEVATION



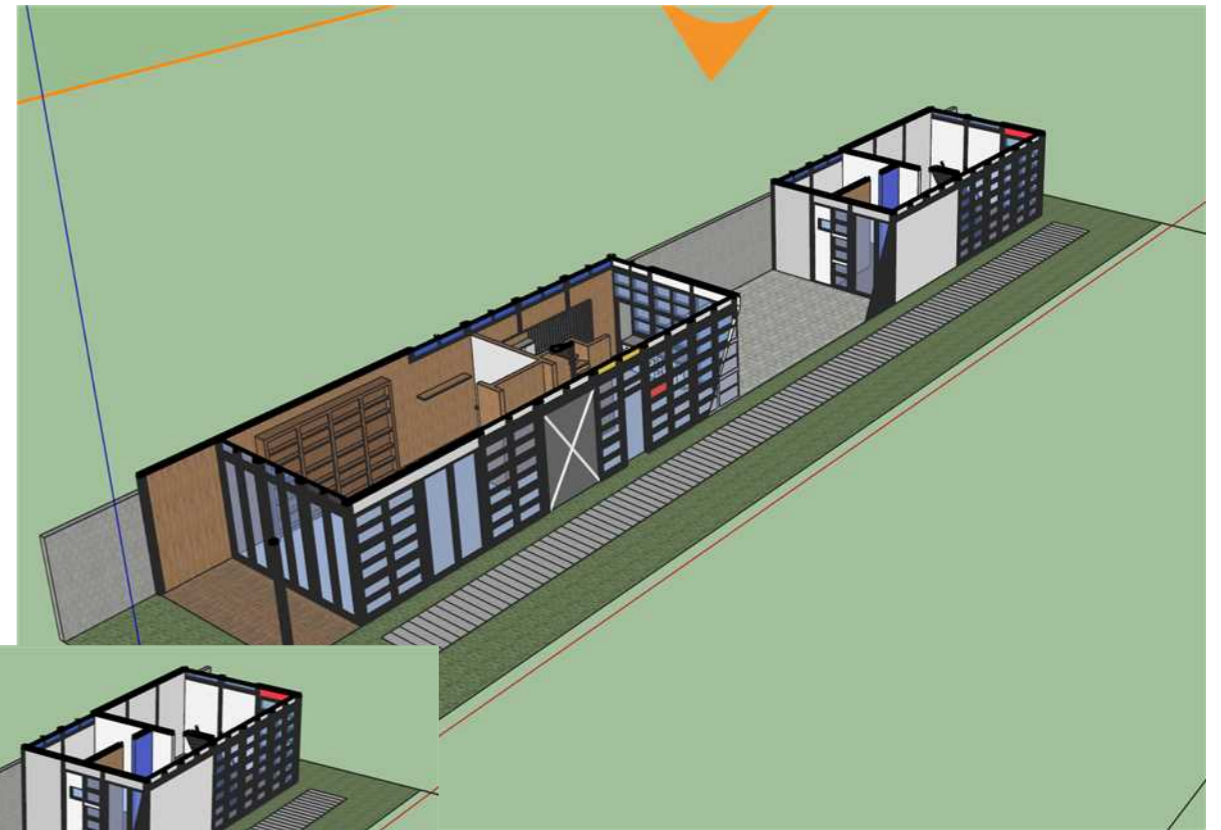
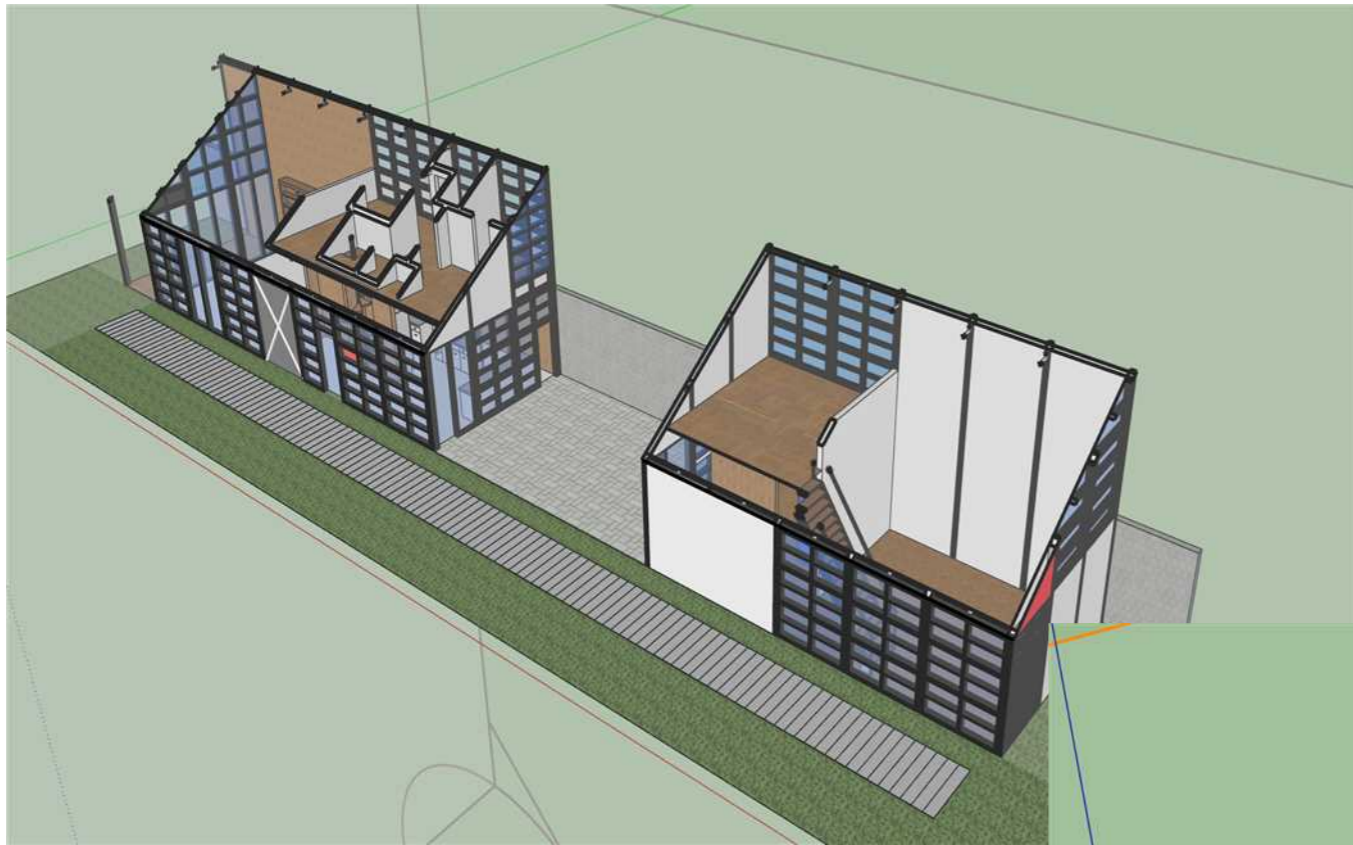


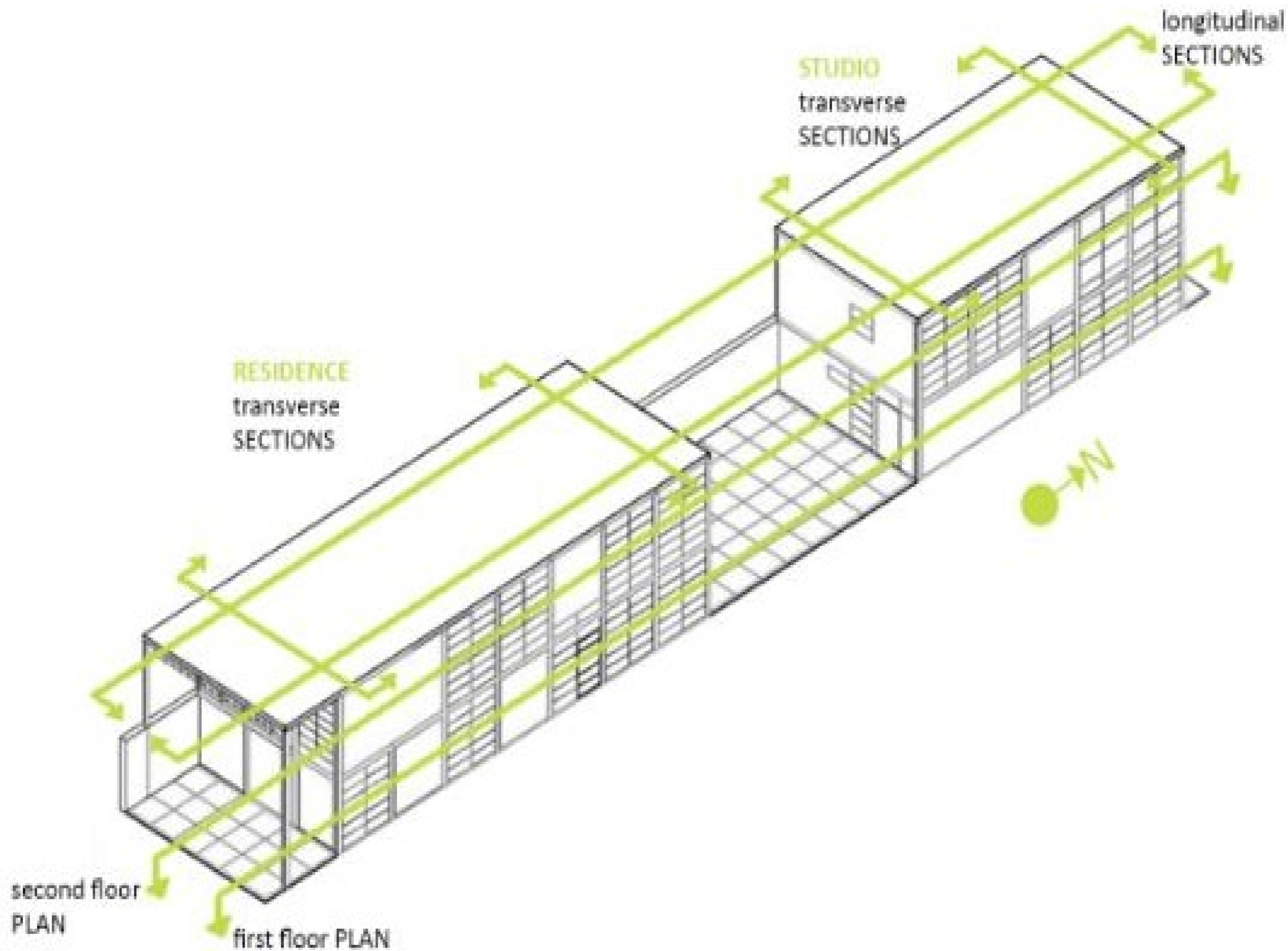
RESIDENTIAL/ WEST ELEVATION

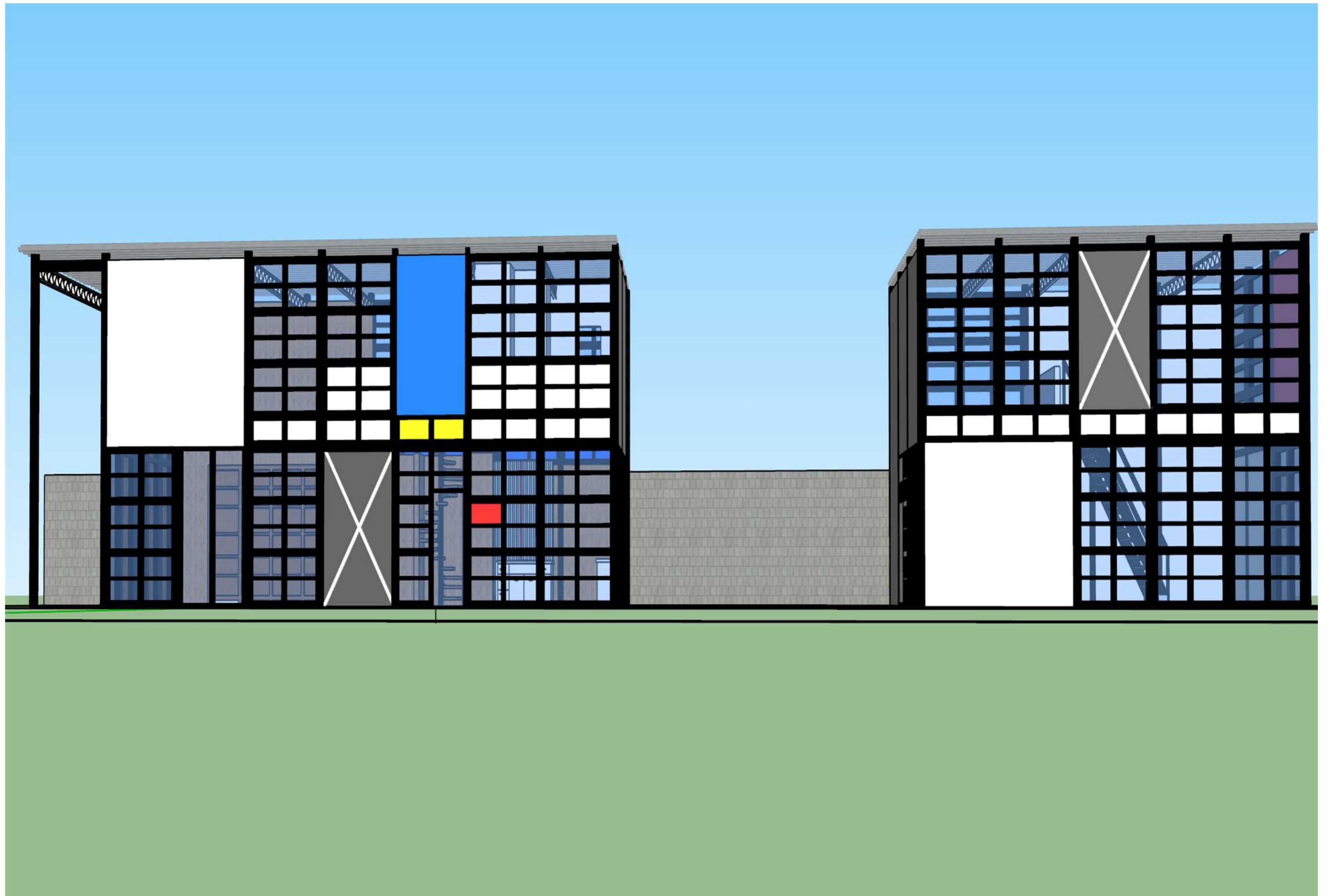


LONGITUDINAL SECTION
